### **Barbara Fuller**


Barbara Fuller died Dec. 7, 2011 in Portland. She was 84.

Born in Loda, Illinois, on Feb. 16, 1927, she grew up in Loda and earned a bachelor's degree from Radcliffe College, graduating in 1948. She was an active community volunteer in the schools, the Democratic Party, a trip leader with the Sierra Club, and a frequent blood donor.

As a member of the DVC library staff, she maintained the card catalog and repaired damaged books. An early adopter of computer technology, she was involved in the library's conversion to an electronic card catalog.

After 16 years at DVC, Barbara retired from the library in 1986. In retirement, she traveled the world, including archeology digs and walking tours in England, classes at Oxford, and mountain treks to the Matterhorn and Mt. Everest.

### Jeanne Hymer describes Chuck Cottril's Workshop presented exclusively for DVC retires!

On a lovely summer day in August, seven DVC retirees took advantage of Chuck Cottril's invitation to meet at his workshop for a wood carving demonstration. We had a great time and enjoyed his hospitality.

We arrived at his workshop in Walnut Creek before 10 a.m. He surprised us with juice and doughnuts and then proceeded to show us his fantastic workshop.

Chuck has developed a very efficient workshop, filled it with professional equipment and has created a safe, clean, work and storage area.

He explained how he obtains his wood, showed us samples of all types wood, and explained how different pieces react differently. Then he carved a piece of wood and demonstrated how he molds wood into a bowl.

He showed us different finishes and explained how a piece can change while it dries. In just two hours, he presented very complete and fascinating basic instruction of wood working.

Afterward, he joined us for lunch at the Pasta Primavara Restaurant, several blocks from his workshop. We all appreciated the demonstration, and, following lunch, we enjoyed his expert instruction.
